Raffle tickets will be £1 per ticket or £5 per Strip.



Finally on Tuesday 13th September we had several members of the Society gathered at Cyprus Hall plus the aerial rigger.

On the previous Friday, in the hall and the shack, there had been several members building the Wellbrook Loop control unit. Also they had put plugs onto several things.

When it came to the Tuesday morning the weather stayed in the main dry although it was chilly.

In total we replaced the G5RV for a End Fed Long wire, this is usable on all the H.F. bands. The Whitestick was replaced

like for like but the 6M part has been tuned so that it now resonant on the Digital part of the band. We placed a new Wellbrook Loop on the back of the building. This is the Antenna that is used for the Kiwi SDR that Berni MOYXF built and trialed at his QTH, it is now installed and working in the Shack at Cyprus Hall.

IT COULD HAVE BEEN WORSE!

The recent high winds blew my Delta Loop out of its tree and dumped the antenna and its halyard onto the lawn. The pulley was still about 50 feet up in the air but I had no way of reaching it to fit a new halyard without expert assistance. The day after the high winds that brought many other trees to the around was no time to go looking for a tree surgeon and in any

case I had things to do unravelling the wires on the ground. Fortunately the loop itself had not snapped, although a falling branch had cut through the 10mm halyard so, to get back on to the 15m net I installed the triangular loop in a horizontal position about 2m off the ground, a real cloud warmer. This produced a radiation pattern rather like the

6 inch off the ground antenna that Chris, 'ZCS and I developed i.e. the radiation went straight up in the air reflected off the ground with a circular pattern about 2000 miles across. This worked fine for

everything in this circle, CT9,7X3,UA0,TF2, all worked at 5+9 amazing for such a low antenna. It didn't prove so good of

course on my 15m net and both Bob, 'XAT and David, W1GN were struggling to copy me. Although they could hear my transmissions signal reports were as expected well down on normal. I did find however that the low loop received very well indeed and I could hear lots of signals that I couldn't get to come back to me.

By the end of the week I had purchased

50m of 10mm line and persuaded a friendly tree surgeon to climb my tree and reinstate the halyard. He also cut away a few thin branches that were preventing my delta loop from facing towards the East coast of the USA and once I had rehoisted the antenna all was well. My first contact with the refitted loop was with Yan, BH1DYK in central China and I had a long chat with Bob PT1ZRT in Rio

proving that the antenna was now working as expected. Bob and David are reporting 5+9 ++ on occasions, which suits me fine.

So, it could have been worse and the past few days have reinforced my belief that a Delta loop is the best wire antenna for any situation and particularly good you can't get your wires up very high. Try one, you'll like it!
